



Personal choices that help to reduce your contribution to climate change



What can you do? Ten ways you can take action today!

TRANSPORTATION

- Consider walking, biking, or public transportation instead of driving a car
- If you need to drive, consider carpooling
- Avoid idling when you can
- Reduce airplane flights when possible

DIET

- Eat a more plant based diet
- Eat local and organic if possible
- Drink tap water

ENERGY/WATER USE

- Unplug devices and
- Turn off the TV, lights, computer and printers when not in use
- Wear an extra sweater instead of turning up the thermostat
- Take 5 min showers

WASTE

- Buy less
- Recycle
- Compost
- Refill and reuse
- Zero waste fashion
- Say no to single-use plastics: straws, water bottles, plastic bags
